- Do not install your machine on a carpet or such grounds that would prevent the ventilation of its base.
- The appliance is not intended for use by people (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Children of less than 3 years should be kept away unless continuously supervised.
- Call the nearest authorized service centre for a replacement if the power cord malfunctions.
- Use only the new water inlet hose coming with your machine when making water inlet connections to your machine. Never use old, used or damaged water inlet hoses.
- Children should not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance should not be made by children without supervision.

**To ensure your safety and the safety of others, please read the following safety precautions before using or installing your Washer Dryer.**

**Your machine is for domestic use only. Using it for commercial purposes will void your warranty.**



## **1.1. General Safety Warnings**

**Before setting up your Washer Dryer, remove the four transit bolts and the rubber washers from the rear of the machine.**

- Your warranty does not cover damage caused by external factors such as fire, flooding and other sources of damage.
- Retain this user manual for future use and pass it on to the next user.
- The necessary ambient temperature for operation of your Washer Dryer is 15-25 °C.
- Where the temperature is below 0 °C, hoses may split or the electronic card may not operate correctly.
- Please ensure that garments loaded into your Washer Dryer are free from foreign objects such as nails, needles, lighters and coins.
- Lints must not be allowed to accumulate around the washer dryer.
- Residue may build up on detergent and softeners exposed to air for a long period of time. Only put

softener or detergent in the drawer at the beginning of each wash.

- Unplug your Washer Dryer and switch off the water supply if the Washer Dryer is left unused for a long time. We also recommend that you leave the door open to prevent build up of humidity inside the Washer Dryer.
- Some water may be left in your Washer Dryer as a result of quality checks during production. This will not affect the operation of your Washer Dryer.
- Keep the document bag that was supplied inside your Washer Dryer and contained this user manual out of the reach of children and babies to prevent the risk of suffocation.
- The packaging of the machine could be hazardous to children. Do not allow children to play with the packaging or small parts from the Washer Dryer.
- Only use pre-wash programmes for very dirty laundry.
- Do not exceed the maximum load for the washing or drying programme you have chosen.
- In the event of a fault, unplug your Washer Dryer and switch off the water supply. Do not attempt to repair your Washer Dryer yourself. Repairs should only be undertaken by an approved service agent.
- Never open the detergent drawer while your Washer Dryer is running.
- Never force the door open when your Washer Dryer is running.
- Please follow the manufacturers' instructions on the use of fabric conditioner or any similar products that you intend to use in your Washer Dryer.
- Do not stop your Washer Dryer before the drying phase of a programme has been completed. If you

have to do so, quickly remove all of your laundry and immediately spread the items on an appropriate surface to allow them to cool.

- The appliance must not be supplied through an external switching device, such as a timer, or connected to a circuit that is regularly switched on and off by a utility.
- This appliance must not be installed behind a lockable door, a sliding door or a door with a hinge on the opposite side to that of the washer dryer, in such a way that a full opening of the washer dryer door is restricted.
- Install your Washer Dryer in a location that can be ventilated and has constant air circulation.

## **SAFETY WARNINGS**

- You must read these warnings. Ignoring these warnings may put you or others at risk of fatal injuries.

## **RISK OF BURNS**

- Do not touch the door, drain hose or any discharged water while your Washer Dryer is running. The high temperatures involved pose a burn risk.
- Open the door fully after the drying process. Do not touch the door glass. It will reach high temperatures and pose a burn risk.

## **ELECTROCUTION RISK**

Do not connect your Washer Dryer to the mains electricity supply using an extension lead.

- A damaged power cord/plug can cause fire or give you an electric shock. When damaged it must be replaced, this should only be done by qualified personnel.



- Never remove the plug from the socket by pulling the cord. Always hold the plug.
- Never touch the power cord/plug with wet hands as this could cause a short circuit or electric shock.
- Do not touch your Washer Dryer if your hands or feet are wet.
- Call the nearest authorised service company for assistance if the power cord malfunctions.

### **Explosion Risk**

- Thoroughly rinse off any chemicals, such as stain remover, from your garments before beginning a washing and drying programme. Failure to do so may cause a risk of explosion when the drying function is used.

### **Fire Risk**

- Do not keep flammable or explosive liquids near your machine.
- Items that have been soiled with substances such as cooking oil, acetone, alcohol, petrol, kerosene, spot removers, turpentine, waxes and wax removers should be washed in hot water with an extra amount of detergent before being dried in the tumble dryer.
- Do not use a detergent ball/device if you have selected a washing and drying programme as this may cause a fire hazard.
- Do not dry your laundry under the conditions specified below as they present a fire risk.
  - If the laundry is not washed.
  - If oil based stains are not pre-treated before beginning a washing or drying programme.
  - Laundry which has been cleaned with industrial chemicals.
  - Laundry that has a high amount of sponge, foam,

rubber or rubber-like parts and accessories.

- Items such as foam rubber (latex foam), shower caps, waterproof textiles, rubber backed articles and clothes or pillows fitted with foam rubber pads should not be dried in the drying process of the appliance.
- Stuffed or damaged items (such as pillows or jackets). The rubber sponge presents a fire risk during the drying process.
- Never use products that contain solvents in your machine.
- Please ensure that garments loaded into your Washer Dryer are free from foreign objects such as nails, needles, lighters, matches and coins.

### **Fall and Injury Risk**

- Do not climb on your Washer Dryer.
- Make sure hoses and cables do not cause a trip hazard.
- Do not turn your Washer Dryer upside down or on its side.
- Do not lift your Washer Dryer using the door or detergent drawer.
- Make sure hoses and cables do not cause a trip hazard.



 **To avoid risk of injury, please take care when moving your Washer Dryer. It is heavy and we recommend that a minimum of two people move your Washer Dryer.**

### **Child Safety**

- Do not allow children to play with the machine.
- Do not leave children unattended near the machine. They might lock themselves in the machine.

- The door glass and machine surface can become extremely hot during operation. Do not allow children to touch the machine; it may damage their skin.
- The packaging of the machine could be hazardous to children. Do not allow children to play with the packaging or small parts from the Washer Dryer.
- Poisoning and irritation may occur if detergent or other washing aids are consumed or come into contact with skin or eyes. Keep cleaning materials out of reach of children.

## **1.2. During Use**

- Do not allow pets near the machine.
- Please ensure that you have removed all of the packaging materials and protective tape from the outside of your Washer Dryer, inside the drum and inside the detergent drawer before using. Check for any external visible damage. Do not install or use your Washer Dryer if it is damaged.
- Your Washer Dryer is for domestic use only and is only intended to wash and dry items which are specified by the manufacturer to be machine washable and dryable on the label and textiles composed of hand washable wool or wool blend fabrics as well as satin, lace, silk and other hand-washable garments. Do not use your Washer Dryer for any purpose not expressly specified in this user guide.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and by persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards

involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be done by children without supervision.

- Installation of your machine must only be carried out by an authorised service agent. Installation by anyone other than an authorised agent will void your warranty.

### **1.3. Packaging and Environment**

#### **DISPOSE OF PACKAGING AND YOUR OLD MACHINE RESPONSIBLY**

##### **Removal of packaging materials**

Packaging materials protect your machine from any damage that may occur during transportation. Please recycle the packaging materials.

Recycled material reduces raw material consumption and lowers waste production.

### **1.4. Savings Information**

Some important information to get the most efficient use out of your machine:

- The amount of laundry you put in your Washer Dryer should not exceed the maximum amount indicated. Avoid overloading to allow your machine to run more efficiently.
- Not using the pre-wash feature for normal and lightly soiled laundry will save electricity and water consumption.

## **Disposal of your old machine**

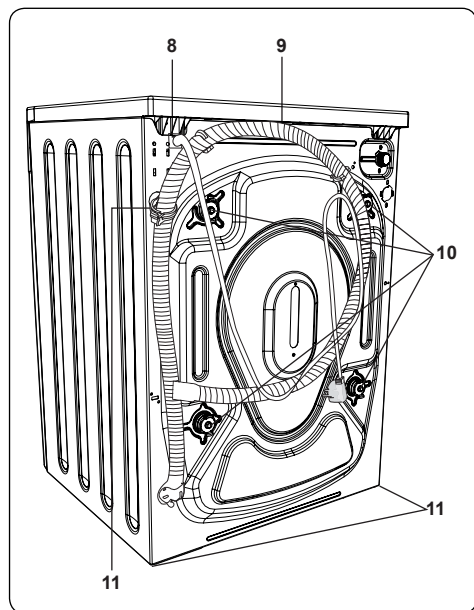
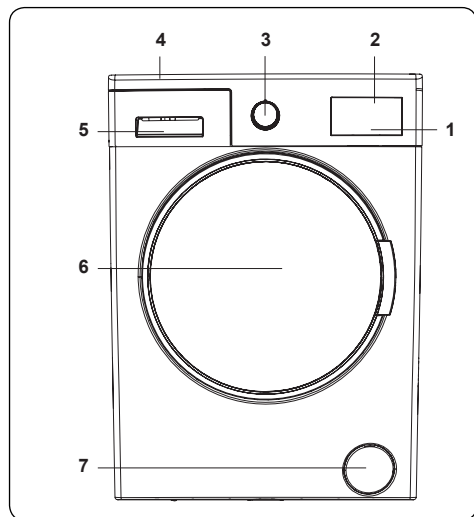

## 3. OVERVIEW OF YOUR MACHINE

### 3.1. General Appearance



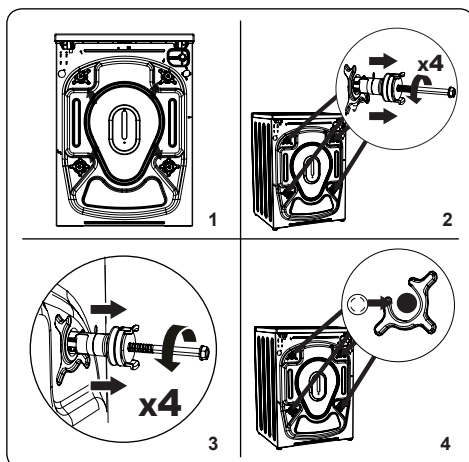
1. Touch buttons
2. High-resolution LCD display
3. Programme Button

## 4. SETTING UP YOUR MACHINE

Your machine must only be installed by an authorised service company.

### 4.1. Remove the Transit Screws



1. Before operating your machine, you must remove the transit screws from the rear of the machine.
2. Loosen the transit screws by rotating anti-clockwise with an appropriate spanner.
3. The transit screws can then be removed with a straight pull. The removed transit screws should be stored in case you need to transport your Washer Dryer in the future.

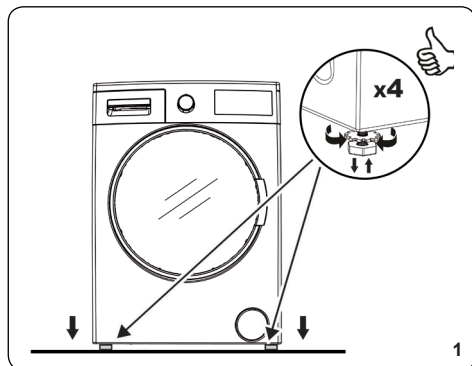


**NOTE:** You must remove the transit screws from your machine before first use. Faults occurring in machines operated with transit screws still fitted are outside the scope of the warranty. Fit the plastic blanking caps supplied in the accessories bag into the gaps left by the removal of the transport screws. The transport screws

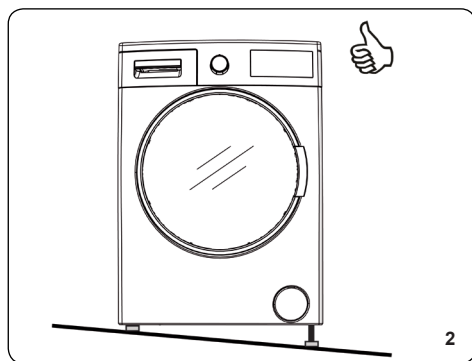
should be stored for future use.

4. Insert the plastic blanking caps from the accessories bag into the gaps left by the transit screws.

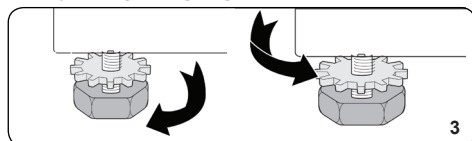
#### 4.2. Placing the Machine and Adjusting the Feet



1. Do not install your machine on a carpet or surface that will block ventilation at the base.
2. To ensure silent and vibration-free operation of your machine, install it on a firm surface.



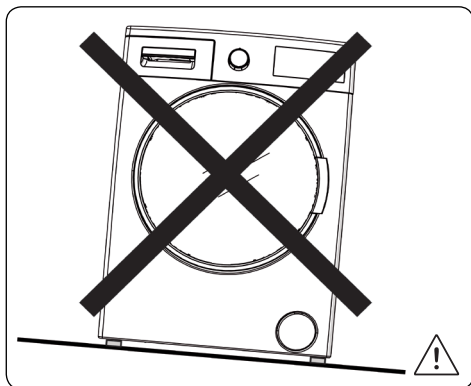
3. You can adjust the level of your machine by using the gauge at the top.



4. You can level your Washer Dryer by using the adjustable feet:
  - Loosen the plastic adjustment nut.
  - Turn the feet clockwise to increase the

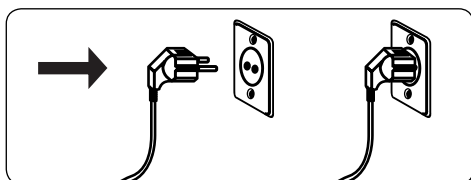
height of the machine. Turn the feet anti-clockwise to decrease the height of the machine.

- Once the machine is level, tighten the plastic adjustment nut.



- Never insert cardboard, wood or other similar materials under the machine to level it.
- When cleaning the ground on which the machine is located, take care not to disturb the level of the machine.

#### 4.3. Electrical Connection



- Your Washer Dryer requires a 220-240V, 50Hz mains supply.
- The mains cord of your machine is fitted with a grounded plug.
- The plug should always be inserted to a grounded socket of 10 amperes. The fuse rating of the plug should also be 10 amperes.
- If you do not have a suitable socket and fuse conforming with this, please ensure the work is carried out by a qualified electrician.
- We do not take responsibility for damage that occurs due to the use of ungrounded equipment.

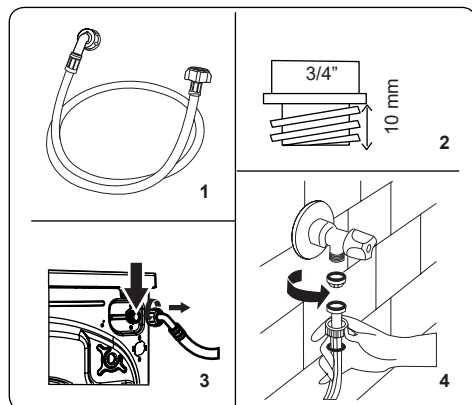


**NOTE:** Operating your machine with



low voltage will cause the life cycle of your machine to be reduced and its performance to be restricted.

#### 4.4. Water Inlet Connection



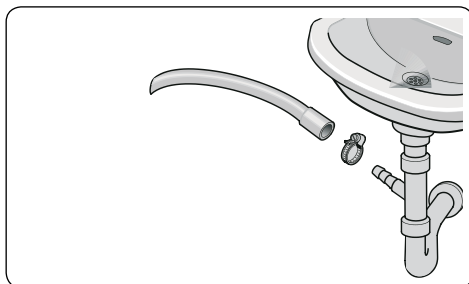
- Connect your Washer Dryer to your cold water supply only.
- Only use the water inlet hose supplied with your machine or one purchased through an authorised dealer.
- A gasket is included in the hose packaging to prevent water leaks from connections. Fit this gasket to the end of the water inlet hose that will be connected to the tap.
- Connect the angled end of the water inlet hose to the cold water inlet on the rear of the machine and hand-tighten.
- Screw the other end of the water inlet hose onto a 3/4" water tap and hand-tighten.
- If in any doubt, consult a qualified plumber.

- Turn the cold water supply on and check for any leaks.
- Water flow with pressure of 0.1-1 Mpa will allow your machine to operate at optimum efficiency (pressure of 0.1 Mpa means that more than 8 litres of water per minute will flow through a fully opened tap).
- Ensure that the the hose is not trapped, kinked, twisted, folded or crushed.

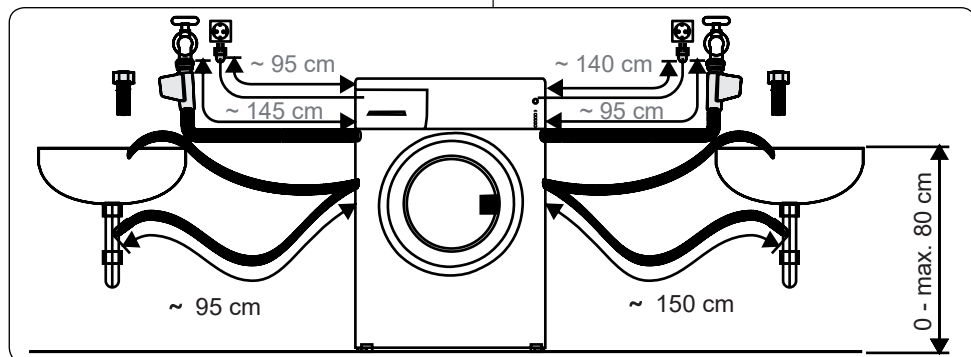


**NOTE:** Only use the water inlet hose supplied with your machine when making connections. Never use old, used or damaged water inlet hoses.

#### 4.5. Water Draining Connection

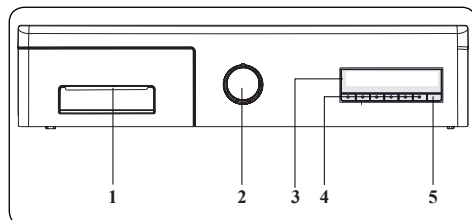


- Connect the water drain hose to a standpipe or to the outlet elbow of a household sink, using additional equipment. The hose must be placed between 0 cm and 80 cm from the ground.
- Never attempt to extend the water drain hose.
- Do not put the water drain hose from your machine into a container, bucket or bathtub.



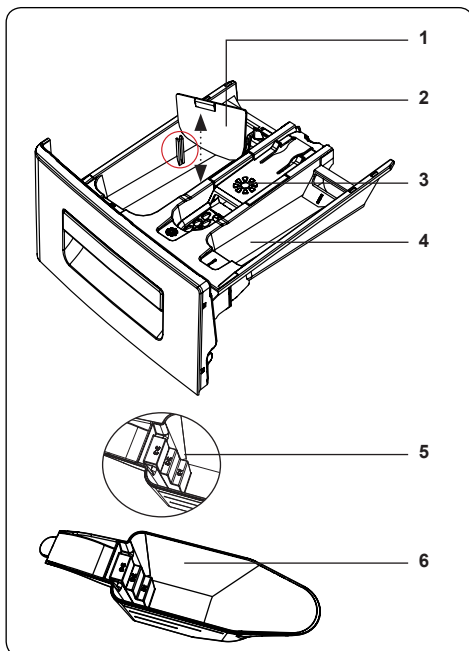
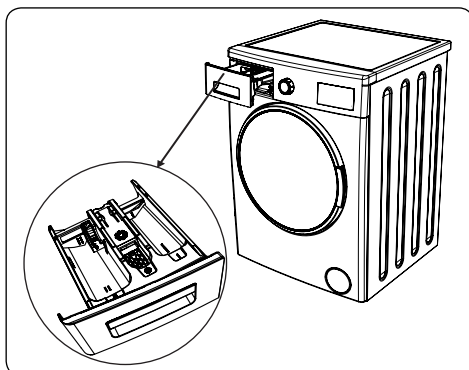
- Make sure that the water drain hose is not bent, buckled, crushed or extended.

## 5. CONTROL PANEL OVERVIEW



- 1. Detergent drawer**
- 2. Programme Dial:** Turn the programme dial clockwise or anticlockwise to select the required programme. Make sure that the dial is pointing exactly at the selected program.
- 3. Info Screen:** Displays details of the selected programme and information on the status of your machine.
- 4. Adjustment and additional function buttons:** The buttons on your machine are touch buttons. You only have to touch them lightly to make a selection.
- 5. Start/Pause button:** Start or Pause the selected programme.

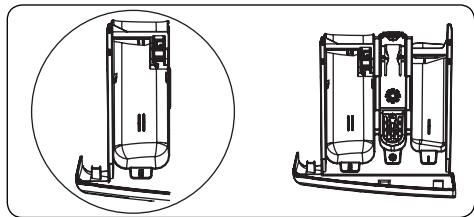

## 5.2. Sections

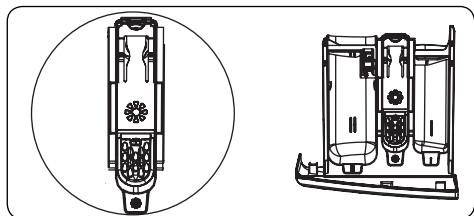
### Main wash detergent compartment:



This compartment is for liquid or powder detergents or limescale remover. The fluid detergent level plate is supplied inside your machine. (\*)

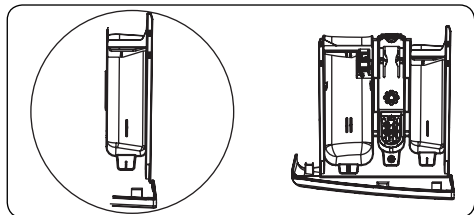

### Fabric conditioner, starch, detergent compartment:



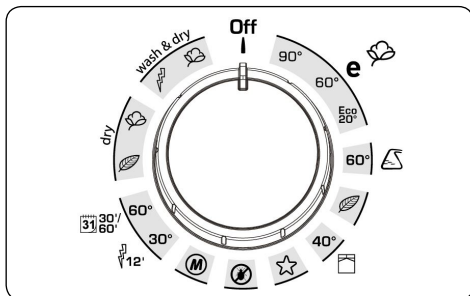
This compartment is for softeners, conditioners or starch. Follow the instructions on the packaging. If softeners leave residue after use, try diluting them or using a liquid softener.

### Pre-wash detergent compartment:



This compartment should be used only when the pre-wash feature is selected. We recommend that the pre-wash feature is used only for very dirty laundry.

## 5.3. Programme Dial



- To select the desired programme, turn the programme dial either clockwise or anti-clockwise until the marker on the programme dial points to the chosen programme.

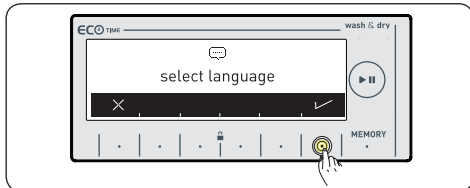
## 6. ADJUSTING MACHINE SETTINGS

Before using your Washer Dryer for the first time:

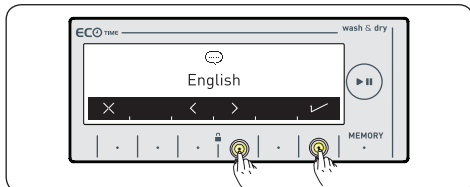
- Plug in your machine.
- Open the water tap.
- Turn the programme dial.

### 6.1. Language Selection Setting

- When setting the language for the first time 'Select Language' will appear on the information screen.



- To change the current language setting press the ✓ button.
- To exit the language selection screen without making a selection, press the ✕ button.



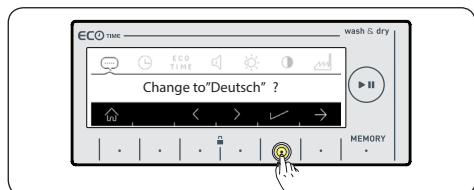
- Select the required language by pressing the <> buttons until the correct language is displayed.
- To confirm the language selection press the ✓ button.



- To change the language selection again, press the [ ] button to open the settings menu and select the language selection page. Then use the <> buttons to select the required language.



- Press the ✓ button to save the language you selected.
- You will be asked to confirm the language selection on screen.



- Press the ✓ button again to confirm the selection.
- If you believe you have selected the wrong language, press the X button to cancel the selection and make another choice.
- When you confirm the language change, the language you have selected will be active.



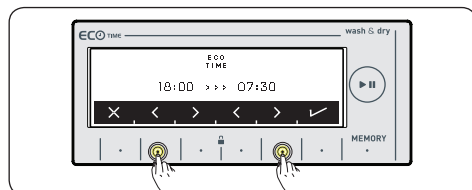
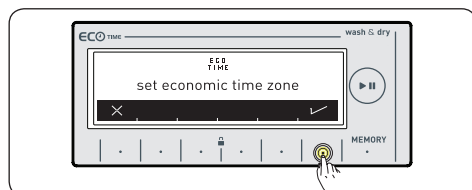
## 6.2. Eco Time Setting E C O (Economic Time Interval) T I M E

- Your Washer Dryer contains an Eco Time Setting option which allows you to set your Washer Dryer to run during the hours when your electricity tariff is more economical. Refer to your electricity provider to find the electricity tariffs and times.

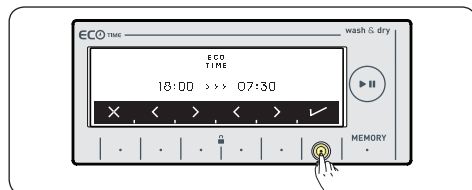


**NOTE:** A smart counter will be required in order for this mode to work.

- Press the ✓ button to set the Eco Time option.
- To set the Eco Time option later, press the X button.



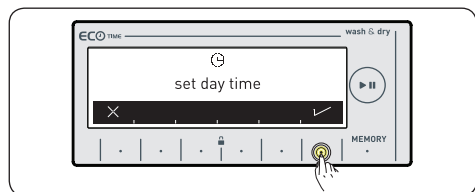
- Use the <> buttons to set the start and end times for the Eco Time interval. See page 21 to activate the Eco Time interval additional function.



- Press the ✓ button to confirm the Eco Time interval.

### 6.3. Current Time Setting

- We recommend that you set the correct time during the initial set-up of your Washer Dryer.



- Your machine will ask you to set the current time. Press the ✓ button to open the Set Time menu or the ✕ button to exit without setting the time.

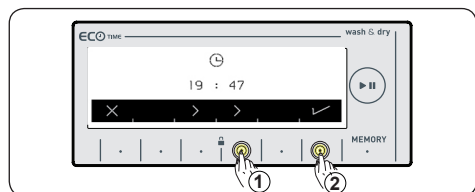


**NOTE:** We strongly recommend that you set the current time accurately as other operating features depend on it.

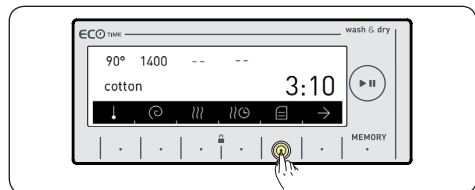


**NOTE:** Time setting information will be lost if you leave your Washer Dryer unplugged for more than 15 days. In this case you will be prompted to set the time when you next turn your Washer Dryer on.

- Use the >> buttons to set the correct hours and minutes.



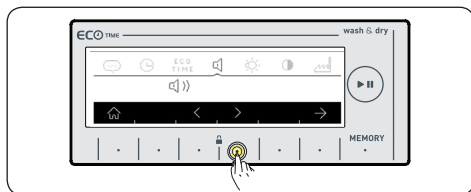
- Press the ✓ button to confirm the time.



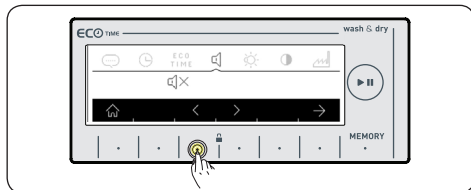
- When you have confirmed the time setting, your machine will automatically go to the main screen of the programme you have selected. To make further changes to your settings, press the ≡ button and select the setting you want to change.

### 6.4. Sound Adjustment

- You can switch the warning sounds of your Washer Dryer on or off. Use the <> buttons to switch between the options below.



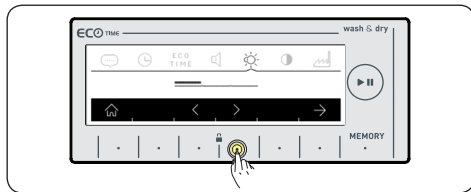
- The 🔊 symbol indicates that warning sounds are switched on.



- The 🔊✕ symbol indicates that warning sounds are switched off.

### 6.5. Screen Brightness Setting

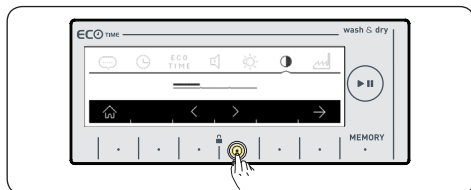
- You can adjust the brightness setting of the information screen on your Washer Dryer. Use the <> buttons to adjust the brightness.



- Press the ➡ button to move to the contrast settings option.

### 6.6. Screen Contrast Setting

- You can adjust the contrast of the information screen on your Washer Dryer. Use the <> buttons to adjust the contrast.

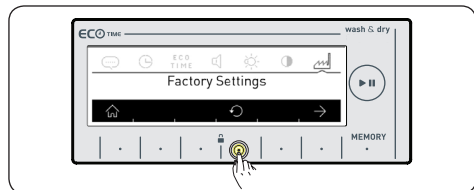


- Press the → button to move to the revert to factory settings option.

## 6.7. Revert to Factory Settings

To reset your Washer Dryer to the factory default settings:

- Press the ↺ symbol.

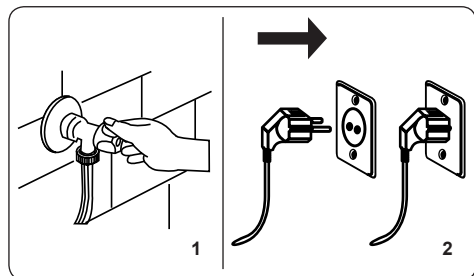


- You will be asked to confirm that you want to reset your Washer Dryer to Factory Settings.




- Press the ✓ button to confirm the reset.
- To cancel the reset press the X button.
- You can return to the main screen at any time by pressing the 🏠 button.

## 7. WASHING OPERATION




1. Turn on the water supply.
2. Plug in your machine

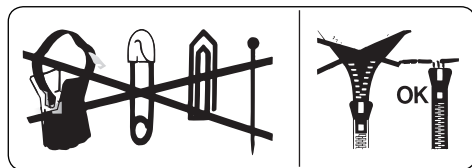
### 7.1. Sorting Laundry

 Your laundry contains product labels which specify the appropriate washing instructions. Wash or dry your laundry according to the instructions on the product

labels.

- Sort your laundry according to their type (cotton, synthetic, delicates, wool, etc.), washing temperature (cold, 30°C, 40°C, 60°C, 90°C) and the level of dirtiness (less dirty, dirty, very dirty).
- Never wash coloured and white laundry together.
- Dark textiles may contain excess dye and should be washed separately several times before being included in a mixed load.
- Ensure that there are no metallic materials on your laundry or in the pockets; if so, remove them.

 **WARNING:** Any malfunction occurring due to foreign materials damaging your machine are not covered by the warranty.



- Close zips and fasten any hooks and eyes.
- Remove the metallic or plastic hooks of curtains or place them in a washing net or bag.
- Reverse textiles such as pants, knitwear, t-shirts and sweat shirts.
- Wash socks, handkerchiefs and other small items in a washing net.

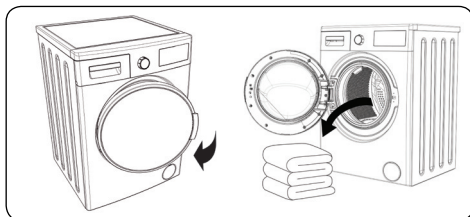
## 7.3. Placing Laundry Into the Machine



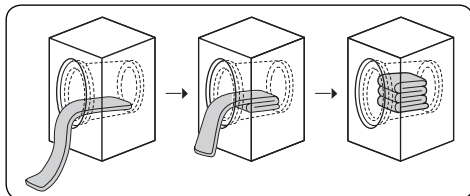
Select a programme before loading laundry into your Washer Dryer. If you do not select a programme the load sensor will not be activated.



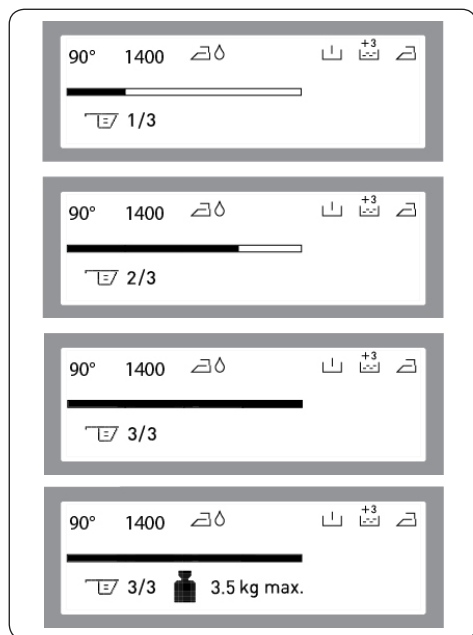
**NOTE:** The maximum load capacity of your Washer Dryer may change according to the programme you have selected. If you exceed the load capacity of the selected programme a symbol will be displayed on the information screen accompanied with a warning sound. If this occurs, we recommend that you remove items of laundry until the symbol disappears.



- Open the door using the handle.
- Check inside the drum. There might be laundry left inside from previous washes. If there is, empty your machine before selecting your programme.
- Place your laundry in the machine, spreading it well. Fold large objects such as quilts and blankets into the machine as shown below.



- Your Washer Dryer contains a load detection system. This load detection system measures the weight of the laundry inside your Washer Dryer and displays the increase in load on the information screen. Your Washer Dryer automatically adjusts programme features such as programme duration, energy consumption and water consumption according to the amount of washing in the drum.
- If you operate your Washer Dryer when it is overloaded, washing and drying performances will be affected. Additionally, your Washer Dryer can be damaged and your clothes may become yellow after drying programs.



- Put each item of laundry into the machine separately.
- Ensure that no laundry is stuck between the cover and door seal when closing the door of your machine.
- Ensure that the machine door is completely closed.
- Tightly shut the door of your machine or the machine won't start the washing operation.

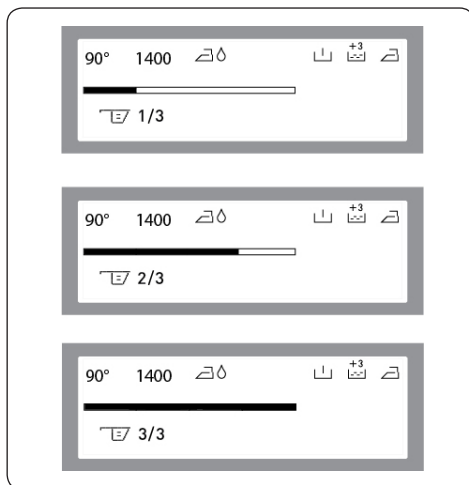
#### 7.4. Choice of Detergent and Placing Into the Machine

The amount of detergent you require will depend on the following criteria:

- How soiled your laundry is.
- The hardness of the water.
- The amount of laundry to be washed.
- If your clothes are only slightly soiled, do not do a pre-wash and put a small amount of detergent (as specified by the manufacturer) into compartment 2 of the detergent drawer.
- If your clothes are excessively soiled, select a programme with a pre-wash and put  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the detergent to be used into compartment 1 of the detergent

drawer and the rest in compartment 2.

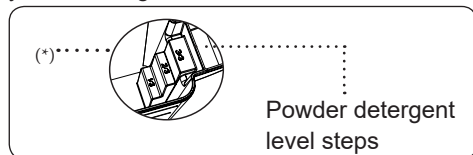
- Use detergents produced for automatic washing machines in your machine. Follow the instructions on the detergent packaging when determining the amount of detergent to use for your laundry.
- Put the softener in the softener compartment in the detergent drawer. Do not exceed the MAX level, otherwise softener will flow into the washing water through flushing.
- Softeners with high density must be thinned before being put in the drawer. High-density softener will clog the flush and block the flow of the softener.
- You can use liquid detergent in all programs without a prewash. To do this, slide the fluid detergent level plate into the guides in compartment 2 of the detergent drawer and adjust the liquid detergent amount (follow the instructions on the liquid detergent packaging). Do not fill the liquid detergent above the MAX level. Only use the fluid detergent level plate for liquid detergent, remove the plate if you are using powder detergent.
- Your machine displays a symbol and indicates how much detergent is required based on the weight of your laundry.



**NOTE:** 3/3 indicates a completely full detergent drawer. Place the correct amount



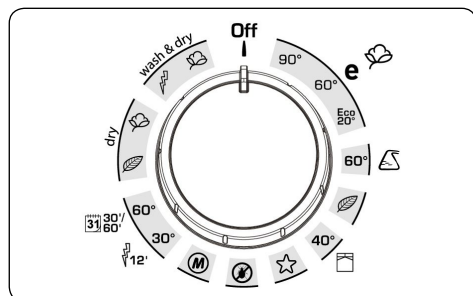
of detergent (as indicated on the screen) in your washing machine.



**!** Do not use a detergent dosage adjustment device/ball if you have selected a programme with a drying function as this could pose a fire risk.

## 7.5. Programme Selection

To select the desired programme, turn the programme dial either clockwise or anti-clockwise until the marker on the programme dial points to the chosen programme.



The programme name and features will be displayed on the screen.



- You can adjust the temperature (\*, 20°, 30°, 40°, 60°, 90°) by pressing the button.
- You can adjust the spin speed (⌀, 400, 600, 800, 1000, 1200, 1400) by pressing the button.

**!** **NOTE:** If you select a drying programme after setting the spin speed, your machine will set the spin speed automatically to enhance drying performance,

- Refer to page (27-31) of the programme table for programme features.

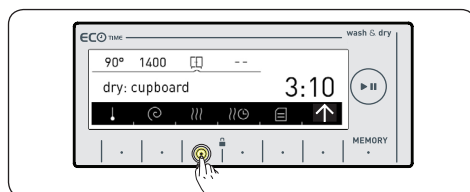
## 8. Drying Your Washing

If you would like your laundry dried at the end of a washing programme, select the required drying setting by pressing the button.

### 8.1. Cupboard Dry

- Recommended for laundry that you will put directly in a cupboard after taking it out of your Washer Dryer.
- To select the Cupboard Dry setting, press the button until the symbol is displayed on the screen.

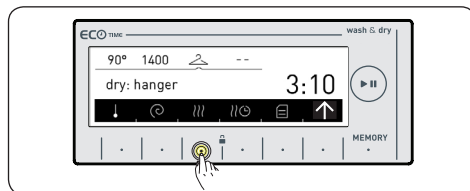

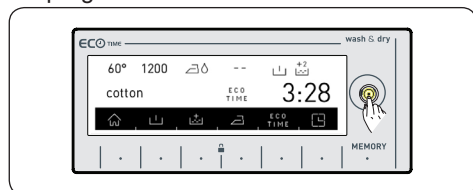
## 9.9. Pausing a Programme / Adding Laundry

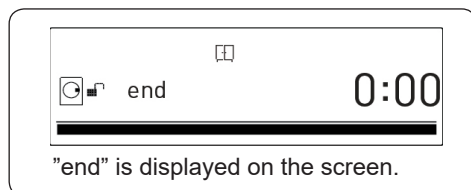

- To cancel a running programme at any time:

## 12. MAINTENANCE AND CLEANING OF YOUR MACHINE

### 12.1. Warning

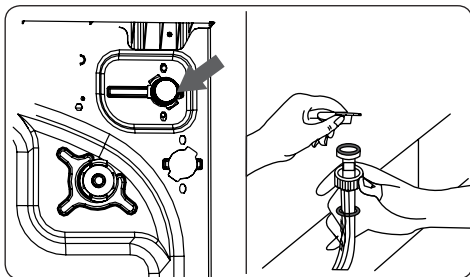


Turn your mains power supply off and remove the plug from the socket before carrying out maintenance and cleaning your machine.

Turn off the cold water supply before starting maintenance and cleaning your machine.

**⚠ CAUTION:** Do not use solvents, abrasive cleaners, glass cleaners or all-purpose cleaning agents to clean your Washer Dryer. They may damage the plastic surfaces and other components with the chemicals they contain.

### 12.2. Water Inlet Filters

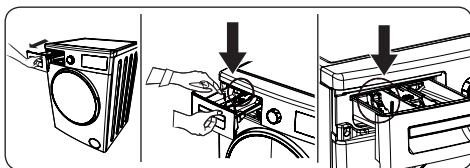


Water inlet filters prevent dirt and foreign materials from entering your machine. We recommend that these filters are cleaned when your machine is unable to receive sufficient water, although your water supply is on and the tap is open. We recommend that you clean your water inlet filters every 2 months.

- Unscrew the water inlet hose from the Washer Dryer.
- To remove the water inlet filter from the water inlet valve, use a pair of long-nosed pliers to gently pull on the plastic bar in the filter.
- A second water inlet filter is located in the tap end of the water inlet hose. To remove the second water inlet filter, use a pair of long-nosed pliers to gently pull on the plastic bar in the filter.
- Clean the filter thoroughly with a soft brush and wash with soapy water and rinse thoroughly. Re-insert the filter by gently pushing it back into place.

**⚠ CAUTION:** The water inlet filters can become clogged due to water quality or lack of required maintenance and may break down. This may cause a water leak. Any such breakdowns are out of the scope of the warranty.

### 12.3. Detergent Drawer



The use of detergent may cause residual build up in the detergent drawer over time. We recommend that you remove the drawer every 2 months to clean the



accumulated residue.

To remove the detergent drawer:

- Pull the drawer forwards until it is fully extended.
- Gently press down on the detergent drawer (as shown above) and pull the drawer from its housing.
- Clean the drawer with water and a soft brush.
- If there is any residue in the drawer housing, remove with a soft brush. Take care to prevent any residue from dropping into the machine.
- Dry the drawer thoroughly and slide it back into the housing.



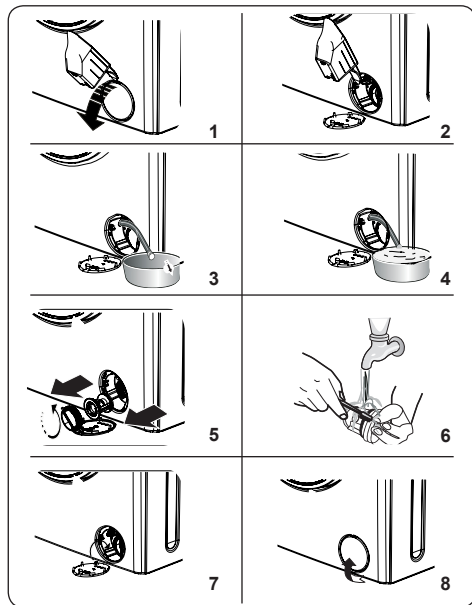
**Do not wash your detergent drawer in dishwasher.**

#### Fluid detergent level plate (\*)

Remove the fluid detergent level plate for cleaning and maintenance purposes, as shown and wash off any detergent residue. Slide the fluid detergent level plate back into the guides. Make sure that there is no remaining detergent residue.

(\*) Specifications may vary depending on the product purchased.

### 12.4. Pump Filter



The pump filter system in your Washer Dryer prolongs the life of the pump by preventing lint from entering your machine. We recommend that you clean the pump filter every 2 months.

The pump filter is located behind the cover on the front-lower right corner.

To clean the pump filter:

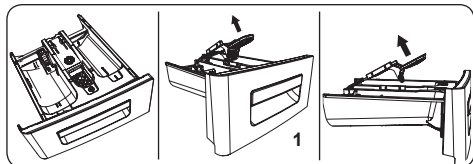
1. You may use the washing powder spade (\*) supplied with your machine or liquid detergent level plate to open the pump cover.
2. Lodge the end of the powder spade or liquid detergent level plate in the opening of the cover and gently press backwards. The cover will open.
3. Pull the black rubber hose forward and detach it from its clamp, place a container under it and remove the plug from the hose.
4. Collect the water drained from your machine in a container.



**NOTE:** Depending on the amount of water inside the machine, you may have to empty the water collection container a few times.

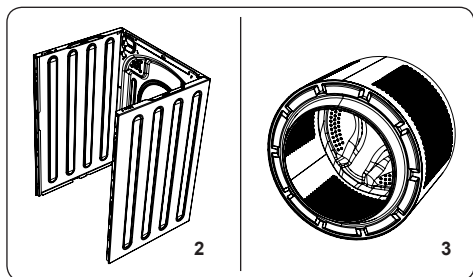
- Once the water has fully drained, fit the plug back on the hose.
- Fit the hose back into the clamp.
- 5. Loosen the filter cover by turning it anticlockwise and remove by pulling.
- 6. Remove any foreign materials from the filter with a soft brush.
- 7. After cleaning the filter replace the filter cover and tighten by turning clockwise.
- Please note that the filter cover may leak water unless re-fitted properly.
- 8. Close the filter cover.
- When closing the pump cover, ensure that the mountings inside the cover meet the holes on the front panel of the machine.

## 13. FLUSH STOPPER / BODY / DRUM



### 1. Flush stopper

Remove the detergent drawer and disassemble the flush stopper. Clean thoroughly to completely remove any softener residue. Refit the flush stopper after cleaning and check that it is seated properly.



### 2. Body

Use a mild, non-abrasive cleaning agent, or soap and water, to clean the external casing. Wipe dry with a soft cloth.

### 3. Drum



Do not leave metallic objects such as needles, paper clips, coins etc. in your machine. These objects lead to the formation of rust stains in the drum. To clean such rust stains, use a non-chlorine cleaning agent and follow the instructions of manufacturer of the cleaning agent. Never use wire wool or similar hard objects for cleaning rust stains.

## 14. TROUBLESHOOTING

Repair of your machine should be carried out by an authorised service company. If your machine requires repair or if you cannot solve an issue with the information provided below, then you should:







- Unplug your machine from the mains power supply.
- Turn off the water supply.
- Contact the nearest authorised service company.

## 15. AUTOMATIC FAULT WARNINGS AND WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE

Your machine is equipped with a built-in fault detection system, which is able to offer guidance should your machine not operate as expected.

## **16. DESCRIBING THE ENERGY LABEL AND SAVING ENERGY**

Energy and water consumption may vary based on water pressure, water hardness, water temperature, ambient temperature, amount of laundry, additional function selection and/or voltage fluctuations.

To reduce energy and water consumption, do not exceed the maximum laundry amounts for the selected programme, wash your laundry when it is lightly soiled or wash your daily laundry in short programmes. Make sure you clean your machine and perform maintenance periodically and use your machine at lower-cost times as specified by your electricity vendor.





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
